The Alliance for Human Services(AHS) uses its website and social media platforms to support its mission of connecting member organizations.

The AHS uses social media to:

- Highlight its activities,
- Distribute information from member organizations about upcoming events and job postings,
- Share resources and news relevant to the human service sector in Lake County.

All social media posts are generated by AHS staff. News sources are screened by AHS staff. Members who would like information about their organization posted on AHS social media sites should forward the requested content in final draft form to AHS staff. AHS staff is not responsible for writing or creating content for member organizations.

The AHS provides a members-only portal on its website to provide members with access to information about the Alliance and a forum to communicate with each other. Information about the AHS such as member directory, calendar of activities, copies of newsletters, is provided and maintained by AHS staff. The message board is available to any member in good standing. Message board participants are responsible for the content that they publish and expected to comply with their organization's policies on advocacy, confidentiality and social media.

AHS staff will monitor and respond appropriately to postings if necessary. The AHS retains the right to remove any post that is not in keeping with these guidelines. Inappropriate or consistent violation of these guidelines may result in loss of AHS social media privileges and/or active membership status.
